Today, the town of Walsall boast a diversity of visible communities and cultures. Of these, the African and Caribbean community have been included in the local fabric of the town area and across the wider Council borough since the 1940s, making a significant contribution to economic and cultural heritage over these many decades. In this, the 75th year of recognizing the 'Windrush Generation' across the United Kingdom, the Walsall Community Association was grateful to host the planning of a special one-day celebratory event under the theme, 'Celebrating the Past, Curating the Present, and Driving the Future.'

Celebrating the Past:

Photographs and other visual mediums were displayed on the walls in the Centre to represent some of the achievements by individuals and groups. In addition, stalls and display holders were invited and presented information on the wide ranging contribution made by that generation to national security, civil and public services (National Health Service, Social care, transport, culture and recreation especially).

Curating the Present:

Video recordings and still photographs were used to capture activities inside and outside of the Centre during the day. These will be collected and archived at the Centre. In years from now the new generations will have access to material collected from the event.

Driving the Future:

A guest speaker, Dr. Maxie Hayles, OBE, presented information on the Windrush Story. He spoke to the several decades of positive contribution and progress made by the Windrush Generation, even in the face of racial discrimination and attempted exclusions. He concluded with exhortations for the subsequent generations to continue to drive forward for an even brighter future in Walsall and elsewhere.
